Honey was highly prized and often given as gifts or traded as a valuable commodity. It was also used medicinally for 'cleaning out the gut'. The honey produced by native bees is often known as 'sugarbag' and contains a lot of resins from native trees such as the eucalypts.

Native beeswax is traditionally used in the sealing and caulking of artefacts and tools as well as the formation of mouthpieces for didgeridoos.
